Finally, I would like to conclude by speaking of our discipline in the context of its history. One of the milestones in our andrology field is the discovery and importance of 5-alpha-reductase as it relates to steroid synthesis and metabolism. The conversion of testosterone to dihydrotestosterone is one of the central enzymatic events in the regulation of male reproductive homeostasis, development and physiology. Looking back several decades ago to the discovery of this enzyme and other androgen-related endocrinology we find the amazing work of the recently passed Jean D. Wilson, MD, (1932-2021). This internationally known endocrinologist contributed tremendously to basic, translational and clinical andrology; his discoveries had a profound impact on our understanding of systemic bodily androgen effects, especially prostate growth and pathology. We are grateful for the avenues of our own research that his insights and experimental results have made possible. The work continues...

CELEBRATING ENDOWMENT GROWTH

The purpose of our endowments is to provide support for ASA annual operations through a secure, stable and predictable source of revenue. The ASA uses its endowment funds' income primarily to support the the annual meeting and keep it as affordable as possible for our members and guests.

In spite of the pandemic, the 2020-21 fiscal year was a very good year for ASA endowment growth:

- \$67,790 was raised from 67 gifts from 54 committed donors;
- The fully funded Richard D. Amelar, MD Endowment was established;
- 100% of the Board of Directors, the Endowment Development (EDC) and Membership Committees made contributions the first time that level of committee giving has been attained;
- The Finance, Nominating and Ethics Committees all had 80%+ of their members contribute;
- Investment return generated by The Cleveland Foundation Growth Fund in 2020 was a very satisfactory 9.0%, which balances growth vs. risk.

Looking forward the ASA's 2021-22 fiscal year, in addition to its normal charge of growing the endowment, the EDC plans to work with the Program and Finance Committees to define more clearly each endowment fund's description and purpose.

We stand in the shade of trees planted by those who have come before us. The ASA gratefully acknowledges the generosity of the following who have "paid it forward" through a charitable gift (read: investment) during the 2020-21 fiscal year. We invite all ASA members to add their name to the donor list in fiscal year 2021-22.

NOTICE ABOUT THE EXTRAMURAL LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM FOR CONTRACEPTION AND INFERTILITY RESEARCH (LRP-CIR)

The NIH Loan Repayment Programs (LRPs) are a set of programs established by Congress and designed to recruit and retain highly qualified health professionals into biomedical or biobehavioral research careers. Additional detailed information about each LRP is provided at <u>https://www.lrp.nih.gov/eligibility-programs</u> and <u>www.lrp.nih.gov/apply</u>. The objective of the LRP-CIR is to recruit and retain highly qualified health and/or allied health professionals into biomedical or biobehavioral research careers as contraception and/or infertility investigators.

The NIH invites qualified health professionals who contractually agree to engage in NIH mission-relevant research for an average of at least 20 hours each week for at least two years, initially, to apply for an award in the Extramural LRP. The Extramural LRP repays up to \$50,000 annually of a researcher's qualified educational debt in return for a commitment to engage in NIH mission-relevant research at a domestic, nonprofit, or government entity. Research funding from NIH is not required to participate in the Extramural LRP. LRP awards are based on an applicant's potential to build and sustain a research career.

Extramural LRP applications will be accepted from September 1 until November 18, 2021. All LRP applications must be submitted electronically using the Application Submission System & Interface for Submission Tracking (ASSIST), <u>https://public.era.nih.gov/assist/</u>.
